Nestled on the banks of the lower Appomattox River in Hopewell, Weston Manor was built by William and Christian Epps Gilliam in 1789 — the year General George Washington was inaugurated as the first president of the United States of America.

With dramatic river views, the lawn and gardens of this lovely Georgian home provide the perfect setting for weddings and receptions. Weddings have been held on the manor's riverside landing, under the trees, and in tents on the lawn. The riverfront stage can be used for music or a dance floor. If you select Weston Manor as your wedding and reception location, the design of your wedding is your own.

Weston Manor's winter kitchen (cellar) is available for bridal showers and bridesmaid luncheons. On the day of your wedding, the winter kitchen can be used for small receptions, gift tables, or a dressing area for the wedding party. The winter kitchen has a convenient kitchen for your caterers.

Only 25 minutes from Richmond and 45 minutes from Williamsburg, Weston Manor's setting is quiet and romantic. Parking on the grounds is ample, but the modern world seems miles away.
